



Step 3: Log in to AwardSpring to view all available scholarships and awards.

Step 4: Complete a general application for any scholarships or awards that fit your profile. There's no need to wait for an Offer of Admission from TMU.

Step 5: Submit your supporting materials (letter of support, written statement, resumé, etc.).

Step 2: Watch for an acknowledgment email with your next steps and TMU Student Number.

Step 3: Track your application status via your ChooseTMU Applicant Portal.

Step 4: Wait to hear from us. We make all of our admission decisions by the end of May.

Step 5: Accept your Offer of Admission through the OUAC.
