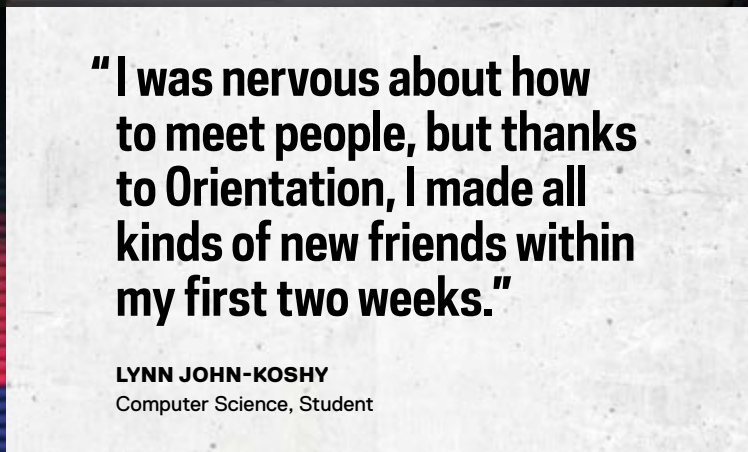

If you're joining us from a province or territory outside of Ontario, or a country other than Canada, you'll need to show evidence that your education is equivalent to the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD), with six Grade 12U/M courses. We'll consider all Grade 11 final marks and Grade 12 interim/final marks in our assessment (where applicable).

Advanced secondary transfer credits

TMU ENGLISH LANGUAGE INSTITUTE (ELI)

If you're academically qualified for TMU, but need to meet our English proficiency requirements, ELI offers university pathways to get you there. Our 8- or 16-week English Boost pathways strengthen your academic English just in time for the start of your undergraduate studies. For more intensive support, our ESL Foundation programs offer four- or eight-month options (based on your placement score), and you can earn up to three credits toward your degree. TORONTO METROPOLITAN UNIVERSITY INTERNATIONAL COLLEGE (TMUIC)

Located on campus in downtown Toronto, TMUIC offers pathways into undergraduate programs at TMU for international students who need support to meet TMU academic requirements. TMUIC offers multiple start-term options, with the ability to progress into university-level programs in Arts, Business Management, Creative Industries, Engineering, Economics and Finance, Professional Communication and Science. UTP Stage II courses prepare students for entry into second-year studies at TMU. Learn more at torontomuic.ca.

JANUARY ADMISSION

Select TMU programs offer winter admission, with a January start, to international students. For more information, visit torontomu.ca/international/admissions/winter.

Apply to TMU

Before you apply, check the admission requirements for your chosen program(s) on the TMU website (torontomu.ca/requirements) and make sure you've taken (or plan to take) the prerequisite courses to satisfy these requirements. Some programs have more competitive (higher) admission averages. Generally, you need an overall average of 70% in six Grade 12U/M courses (or their equivalent), and all programs require a Grade 12 English course (or equivalent).

Step 1: Submit your application

When you're ready to apply, visit the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC) website at ouac.on.ca. If you're not studying full time in an Ontario secondary school, you can check torontomu.ca/apply for other available application methods.

Step 2: Upload required documents

We'll acknowledge your application via email; then you can activate your TMU Online Identity and get access to the ChooseTMU Applicant Portal. This is where you can upload supporting documents, non-academic requirements and other information.

Note: If you're a current Ontario secondary school student, your grades are submitted by your guidance counsellor directly to the OUAC.

Step 3: Apply for scholarships and awards

Once you have access to the ChooseTMU Applicant Portal, log in to AwardSpring (torontomu.awardspring.ca) to explore and apply for scholarships. Be sure to submit your applications early so you don't miss any deadlines.

Step 4: Check your status and watch your email

Log in to your ChooseTMU Applicant Portal (torontomu.ca/choosetmu) to check the status of your application and to view official documents (such as your Offer of Admission). When communications from us remain unread, we'll send you an email reminder.

DEADLINE: FALL 2027 ADMISSION

February 1, 2027, is the guaranteed consideration deadline. Complete applications received by this date will receive equal consideration for fall 2027 entry. Non-academic requirements are also due by February 1 or within 10 days of the application, whichever is later (see individual program web pages for more details).

FAQs

When will I receive an Offer of Admission?

Most programs make offers on a rolling basis. Generally, early offers are based on very strong Grade 11 and/or first-semester Grade 12 academics. Programs with non-academic requirements may make offers later depending on their evaluation of the various elements (auditions, portfolios, etc.).

What does it mean to be on a wait list?

Some popular programs receive many more applications than there are available spaces. If you apply by February 1, you'll be notified by late May if you've been placed on a wait list. If you're placed on a wait list, you may be contacted at any time up to the beginning of classes regarding an offer, subject to space availability.

Financing your education is an important step in preparing for university. Scholarships, awards, government assistance and part-time work can all help support your studies. 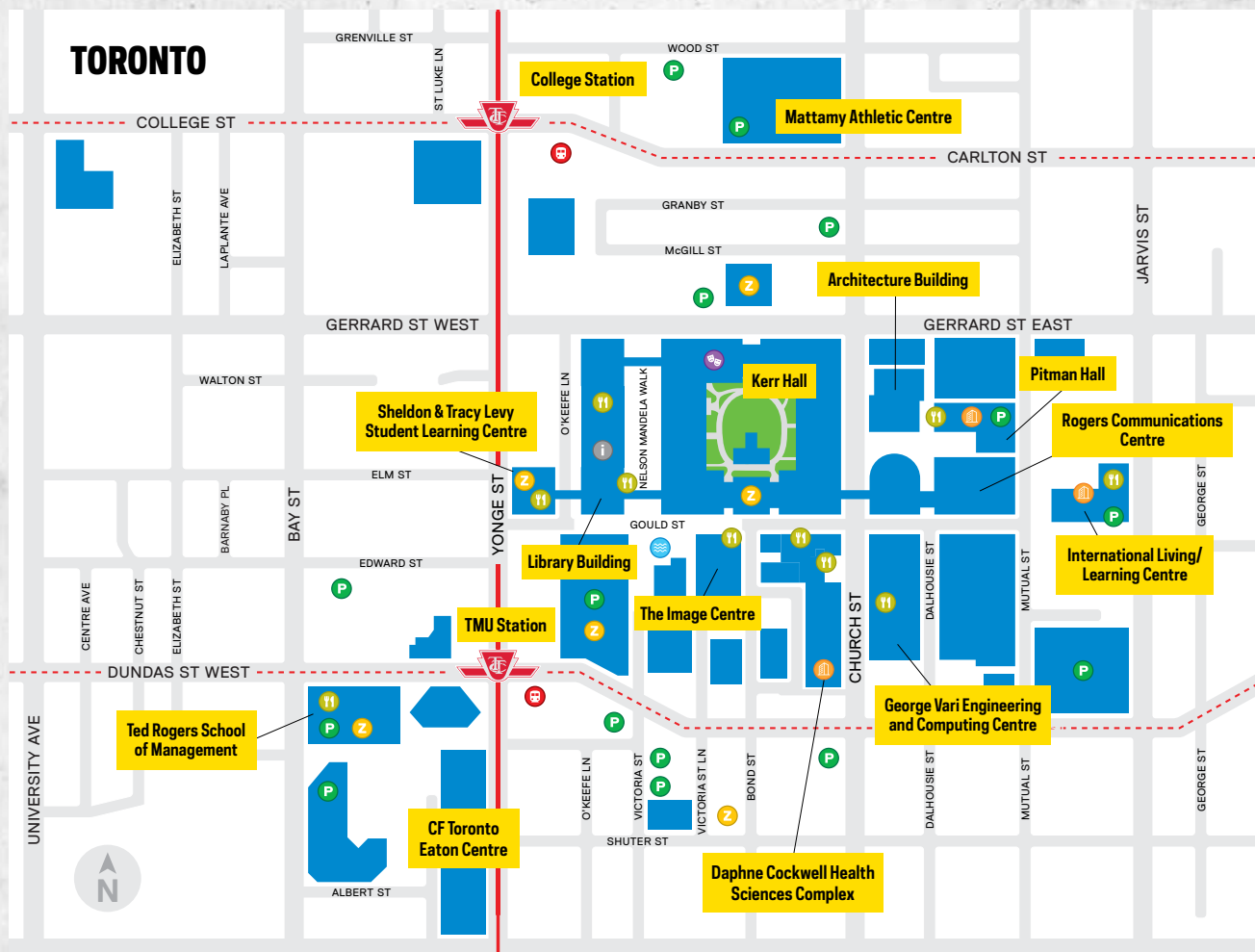
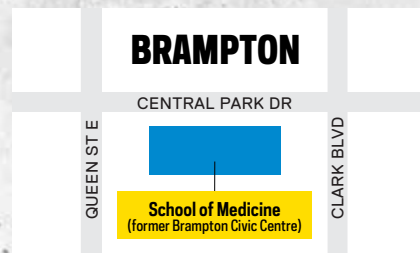
