Strongly Recommended you take at least two Introductory level courses in areas you may choose as your Option in later years:

- o **Culture Studies:** At least two of [ENG 110](#), [SOC 105](#), [PHL 201](#), [PHL 366](#) (wait to take [ACS 302](#) in 2nd year).
- o **Diversity and Equity:** At least two of [ENG 110](#), [PSY 102](#), [SOC 105](#) (wait to take [ACS 403](#) in 2nd year).
- o **Global Studies:** [POG 100](#) and at least one of [ENG 110](#), [SOC 105](#), [PHL 201](#) (wait to take [ACS 402](#) in 2nd year).
- o **Anthropology:** [ANT 100](#) and [LIR 100](#).
- o **English:** [ENG 110](#) and [ENG 208](#).
- o **French:** Most advanced two possible of [FRE 301](#), [FRE 401](#), [FRE 501](#), [FRE 601](#) or [FRE 701](#) (based on placement test)
- o **History:** Two of [HIS 104](#), [HIS 105](#), [HIS 106](#), or [HIS 107](#) (or a few others)
- o **Philosophy:** [PHL 201](#) and one of [PHL 101](#), [PHL 333](#), [PHL 366](#)

## Important Information

- After you enroll in courses, check RAMSS for your timetable.
- Classes are scheduled weekly as a three-hour lecture OR two-hour lecture and one-hour tutorial.

- Students are encouraged to run an [Academic Advisement Report through RAMSS](#) to help them determine what courses they need to enroll in and to ensure that the courses apply to their program graduation requirements.
- The typical course load is 5 courses per semester. Students should speak to their Program Administrator if they wish to reduce course load.
- Instructors will provide course outlines (including required texts) to students via D2L on the first day of classes.

- Students are encouraged to use Visual Schedule Builder (VSB) to help create their optimal class schedule.

- Open electives available in a given semester can be found under "my classes offered" on RAMSS. The courses are divided by teaching faculty and then alphabetically by course codes. There are over 500 courses available as Open Electives, so students should focus their search on specific areas of interest. 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## Transfer Students

If you have received confirmation about receiving transfer credits for first year courses, you can select courses from Year 2 (or higher) requirements or electives. If you have not yet received confirmation about transfer credits, please enroll in courses as if you have not been granted them, but be prepared to drop the courses if confirmation is received. **IN ALL CASES**, it is recommended that you consult with the Program Administrator, for further clarification.

**INTERESTED IN COMPLETING A MINOR?** TorontoMU's Minor Policy allows students to earn any Minor. Refer to TorontoMU's calendar for a complete list of [minors](#) and the minor course requirements. Many of the courses in Required Group Table I and Open Electives can be used towards a minor.

**INTERESTED IN POSSIBLY SWITCHING TO ANOTHER PROGRAM NEXT YEAR?** Arts & Contemporary Studies students need to apply to switch programs through admissions. Some programs are highly competitive and selective, just as in direct-admissions from high school. However, if you are already certain you would like the option to apply to possibly change programs, you should take the required introductory courses in those subjects as either your Table I electives or Open Electives, as follows (for the Faculty of Arts):

<b>SOCIOLOGY</b>	SOC 105 and SOC 107	<b>PSYCHOLOGY</b>	PSY 102 and PSY 202
<b>POLITICS AND GOVERNANCE</b>	POG 100 and POG 110	<b>CRIMINOLOGY</b>	CRM 100 and CRM 102
