Program Course Restrictions

- Students cannot use Sociology courses to meet their Table I requirements.
- Students cannot use Sociology courses to meet their Table A or B requirements [lower or upper level liberal studies courses]. PHL 214 is not available for credit on Table A. First year students should not be selecting courses from Table A; Table A is taken in second year.

Important Information

- After you enroll in courses, check RAMSS for your timetable.
- Classes are scheduled weekly as a three-hour lecture OR two-hour lecture and one-hour tutorial.

- Instructors will provide course outlines (including required texts) to students via D2L on the first day of classes.
- Login to my.ryerson.ca to access RAMSS, D2L Brightspace, and your Ryerson GMAIL.
- Always check your Ryerson email account regularly for important information & updates from your program and the university.
- Students are encouraged to use Visual Schedule Builder (VSB) to help create their optimal class schedule.
- Some courses have a wait list function. To add yourself to a wait list, please refer to the [Course Wait List website](#).
- Open electives available in a given semester can be found under "my classes offered" on RAMSS. The courses are divided by teaching faculty and then alphabetically by course codes. There are over 500 courses available as Open Electives, so students should focus their search on specific areas of interest. Transfer Students
