



Steps to Success: Internship Opportunities for TMU Undergraduate Students

The Migrant Integration in the Mid-21st Century: Bridging Divides research program offers **Steps to Success Internships** designed to provide training, mentorship, and paid employment to TMU undergraduate students who self-identify as members of underrepresented and equity-deserving groups.

Steps to Success Interns will support Bridging Divides in addressing knowledge gaps in migration research within one of the program's research themes:

- Immigrant Health and Well-Being
- Employment and Lifelong Learning
- Place and Infrastructure
- Citizenship and Participation

What types of internship are available?

Bridging Divides has allocated **12 internship positions** with an hourly wage of **\$22**. Internships can be completed during either the Summer term or the Fall/Winter term, for a maximum of 16 weeks per term.

Summer term: Full-time, 30 hours per week

Winter/Fall term: Part-time, 15 hours per week

How does a student qualify?

Applicants must be domestic or international undergraduate students enrolled full-time at TMU.

How does a student apply?

To apply for a Bridging Divides Steps to Success Internship, students must review the Bridging Divides research themes and identify an active research project that aligns with their interests.
