



## PARTICIPANTS WANTED: Examining the trajectories of French nationals studying in Canada

French students are the fifth largest group of international students in Canada in 2023. We are conducting a research project on French students and highly skilled workers' migration related decision making and trajectory. Our objective is to understand the motivations and experiences of French students who have studied in Canada. ### Eligibility criteria:

- you are of French nationality, whether you reside in Canada OR any other country during the study
- you are between 18 and 45 years old
- you are currently studying at a Canadian university OR college, OR you have previously studied at a Canadian university or college
- you have resided in Canada for at least 4 months

### Survey details:

- surveys will take approx. 15-20 minutes
- the survey is in French
- responses will remain fully anonymous
- participants will be entered in a draw to win a \$100 gift card

- interviews will be audio recorded to allow for the researchers to transcribe the conversation (researcher will ask for permission to record before beginning)

- participants will receive a \$25 Visa gift card for participating in the study
