Look Globally - Act Locally: Integrated Care Systems

Registration is now open!

This symposium, presented by the Canadian Research Network for Care in the Community (CRNCC) and the Ontario Community Support Association (OCSA), features top speakers from Canada and from European countries such as Austria, the Netherlands, Finland, and the United Kingdom. These countries have implemented or are currently implementing integration initiatives. A key goal is to learn more about what works, what does not, and what needs to be done at the local level to ensure success.

Topics include:

- which populations are targeted
- what services are included
- who decides
- who pays and how
- how are outcomes measured
- how are providers and funders held accountable
- What is the role of informal and family care givers

Ongoing concerns about the sustainability of publicly funded health care in the face of changing demographics, rising costs, and persistent shortages of human resources, set the context for a policy push toward more integrated health and social care systems locally, nationally, and internationally. Results have been mixed. Some integration initiatives in some jurisdictions have shown considerable success in meeting population needs and improving system sustainability. Others have yet to demonstrate positive outcomes.

Who should attend: policy makers (LHINs, MOHLTC), researchers, managers (CCACs), and community service providers.
