



ISCI Impact Award

The International Society for Child Indicators (ISCI) is delighted to announce its biennial award **Impact Award**. The **ISCI Impact Award** provides recognition to those, whether individuals or organizations, who have used child well-being indicators in ways that have aimed to make a direct impact on the well-being of children. Through this award, ISCI recognizes that many members of the ISCI community focus as much on impact as on scholarship and that applied child indicator work is highly valued within ISCI.

The award will be granted at the 10th ISCI Conference “*Thriving in Context: Child Wellbeing Across Environments*” which will be held June 29-July 1, 2026 in Corvallis, Oregon – celebrating our 10th conference and our 20th anniversary as an association.

The award is open to individuals as well as organizations. Any activities that use child well-being indicators to advance children’s lives can be nominated for the award. Such activities may include, but are not limited to:

- increasing public awareness,
- monitoring child conditions,
- informing policy/evaluating policies and programs,
- mobilizing advocates for children,
- advocacy activities.

Nominations of people or groups may be submitted by others. Self-nominations are not accepted. The submission should include the following information and points 1 through 3 should not exceed 2 pages:

- 1) Name and contact information of the person or organization being nominated.
- 2) Name, contact information and affiliation of the nominator.
- 3) A statement regarding the activity or activities that merit the ISCI Impact award (Please provide detail as to how child indicators have been used and the resulting benefits).
- 4) Any endorsements or recommendations from other individuals or organizations supporting the nomination.

Please submit your nominations by **May 17, 2026**.

The award will be judged by the ISCI Awards committee.
