

Ryerson Renaming: Survey of Community Members

Welcome to the survey!

On August 26, 2021 the university's Board of Governors accepted the 22 recommendations put forward by the Standing Strong (Mash Koh Wee Kah Pooh Win) Task Force to guide commemoration at the university and to address the legacy of Egerton Ryerson. **One of the recommendations was to rename the university through a process that engaged with community members.**

This survey invites you to share your perspectives and ideas about a new name for the university – one that will reflect its aspirations and vision for the future. It will take most people about 10 minutes to complete. All of your responses will be anonymous.

The survey findings will help the University Renaming Advisory Committee (URAC) with the development of a shortlist of possible names. High-level findings and participation statistics will be shared through a community update from the URAC in January 2022.
