What is Academic Misconduct?

"Any behaviour that undermines the University's ability to evaluate fairly students' academic achievements

or

any behavior that a student knew, or reasonably ought to have known, could gain them or others unearned academic advantage or benefit, counts as academic misconduct."

(Policy 60: Academic Integrity, Section 2)



Pol 60: Academic Misconduct

- Plagiarism
- Cheating
- Misrepresentation of personal identity or performance
- Submission of false information
- Contributing to Academic Misconduct
- Damaging, Tampering, Interfering with the Scholarly Environment
- Unauthorized Use of Intellectual Property
- Misconduct in Re-graded/Re-submitted Work
- Violations of Specific Departmental or Course Requirements



Plagiarism - Not citing correctly

"...words, ideas, artistry, drawings, images or data of another person ...including information found on the Internet and unpublished materials....as if they are one's

OWN..." (Section 2.1.1)

"...submitting the same work, in whole or in part, for credit in two or more courses, or in the same course more than once, without the prior written permission of the instructor" (Section 2.1.5)



Cheating – Group Work

"Collaborating on work to be evaluated where such collaboration has been expressly forbidden by the instructor." (Section, 2.2.9)

If not clear, ask about expectations re group work



Contributing to Academic Misconduct

"Offering, giving, sharing or selling essays, questions and/or answers to tests or exams, quizzes or other assignments unless authorized to do so" (Section 2.5)
