During her time at TMU, Kiara-Kumail has explored various aspects of performance led by some of Canada's top theatrical/film practitioners, from classical work such as *'Richard III'* with Tim Welham, to contemporary works like Andrew Kushnir's play in development, *'The Division'* at Tarragon Theatre. A highlight of their career thus far was working on the short film, *'Re:gen(d)eration'* with an almost entirely trans/non-binary cast and crew. They've also studied more unique aspects of performance at TMU such as Motion Capture with Ivan Sherry, and Intimacy Direction with Siobhan Richardson, which they're especially interested in growing as a skill further in the future. Outside of TMU she's also trained in workshops on basic unarmed fight combat with Affair of Honor, even being nominated as the fight captain on the *'Sister Warriors'* workshop.

When she's not crying on demand, she enjoys singing (baritenor), dancing (sometimes badly), and curiously learning about people and the deep sea. Fun Fact: She hopes to explore the Mariana Trench at least once in her life. They're also very involved in social justice activism, particularly in relation to LGBTQ+ issues.
