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COMPETITION OVERVIEW

PURPOSE

The 2022 Strategic SRC Initiative Fund will:

- Support exploratory programs of research or collection of multidisciplinary research projects towards scaling opportunities
- Strengthen collaboration amongst multidisciplinary and multisectoral researchers
- Address increasingly interconnected, complex problems
- The maximum amount per award is \$20,000 for a period of one year

ELIGIBILITY

All Ryerson University full-time tenured or tenure-track faculty members are eligible for funding.

You are **not eligible** to apply for this competition if you have any internal or external funding for any SRC project that is or may be related to your proposal.

APPLICATION PROCESS

HOW TO APPLY

- Applications are submitted via the Research Information System (RIS) as a Grant Authorization Form (GAF)
- Your application package must include 3 separate PDFs:
 - 1. Completed Application Cover Page
 - 2. Proposal
 - 3. Updated Common CV or OCGS CV

PROPOSAL cont'd

Proposal format:

- Times New Roman, 12-point font;
- Single spaced (no condensed/narrow fonts, type or spacing);
- One-half (0.5") inch margins around the page; and
- PDF file format.



EXPENSE ELIGIBILITY

Funds can be used only for research-related costs that conform to the university's guidelines regarding pay and benefit rates and allowable expenses.

For guidance, visit Financial Services - Research Accounting

Examples of eligible expenses:

- Salaries, stipends and benefits for research personnel
- Research equipment and supplies
- Computers, hardware and software for research not available through the University
- Books, periodicals, specialized office supplies not provided by Ryerson Library
- Travel and meal allowances directly related to research project

Examples of ineligible expenses:

- Purchase or rental of software and equipment available through Ryerson University
- Professional training or development
- Cost for preparation of teaching materials
- Research personnel or team meeting costs
- Transport of research personnel for supervisory or academic purposes
- Expenditures unrelated to dissemination

- 2 RFA representatives from each of the faculties
- AVP, Research and Innovation, will chair the committee
- Recommended ranked list is forwarded to the VPRI for final approval and dissemination of funds
- Proposals will be assessed based on the following criteria:
 - Excellence and Strategic Alignment
 - Feasibility
 - SRC Impact
 - Equity, Diversity, Inclusion and Access

1. Excellence and Strategic Alignment

- Extent to which the proposed project responds to the funding objectives.
- Originality and significance of research question(s) and objectives.
- Clarity and appropriateness of the proposed approach/study design.

Excellence and Strategic Alignment	30	30

2. Feasibility

- The expertise and experience of the applicant(s) in relation to the proposed research relative to the stage of the applicant's career.
- Appropriateness of the proposed timeline and probability that the objectives will be met.
- Appropriateness of the requested budget, justification of proposed costs; and, where applicable, other financial and/or in-kind contributions.

Criterion	Emerging Scholar Scoring	Established Scholar Scoring
Feasibility	30	20

3. SRC Impact

- Extent to which the research proposal addresses a significant need or gap.
- Quality and appropriateness of the proposed knowledge mobilization opportunities between researchers, community, decision makers and/or policy leaders, including dissemination and/or application of research results.
- Quality of training and mentoring to be provided to students, post-docs, emerging scholars and/or other highly qualified personnel, and opportunities for them to contribute, relative to the stage of the applicant's career.

SRC Impact	20	30

- 4. Consideration of equity, diversity, inclusion and access throughout the project and as applicable to the field of research
 - Quality and appropriateness of the EDIA considerations throughout all relevant stages of the research process including planning, research questions, design, methods, data collection, analysis, interpretation and/or dissemination of research findings.
 - For research involving Indigenous Peoples: Appropriate consideration of TCPS2: Chapter 9 and demonstration of meaningful and culturally safe practices, plans and activities throughout the research project.

NEXT STEPS - ETHICS

- University research is governed by policies and practices that cover research involving humans, the use of animals, controlled goods and hazardous materials, among others
- Funds will not be released prior to Research Ethics Board (REB) approval
- If you are unsure of whether your study requires REB review and approval, contact one of the REB Administrators



NEXT STEPS cont'd

If awarded, please:

- Commence projects within 3 months of award notification date;
- Sign Agreement/Terms and Conditions before carrying out research activities;
- Submit all expenses (with supporting documents) as they are incurred to your Faculty's Research Account Support Officer (RASO);
- Submit a written report within 3 months of completion of the project or 1 calendar year after the release of funds, whichever comes first; and
- Acknowledge the support of the University in the dissemination of research results.
