




# **Zone Learning**

Our approach builds skills and mindsets that complement academic learning and support the growth of individuals.








Joined the Science Discovery Zone with a question "can you grow plants without soil?"

Is now pursuing a career in teaching







\$38K+ in zone awards & competitions50+ attendees to product launch event hosted in the brand newCUI building





**Examples include**: in-class visits, zone-led modules, startup-based case studies, formal curricular integrations, internships, and capstone projects.








