I am pleased to provide this update to Senate highlighting the activities of the Senate Learning and Teaching Committee (SLTC) for the academic years 2019/20 and 2020/21. The role of the SLTC is to advise Senate on select university-wide issues through the lens of learning and teaching; to initiate, as required, activities that address specific issues; and to develop and make academic policy recommendations for the consideration of Senate.

The committee met a minimum of four times in each academic year. A major focus of the last two years has been to affect systemic change though input on key Senate policy revisions and new policy creation.
