What to Expect and How to Prepare

What Are Case Interviews?

Case interviews are simulations of a business project that a full-time Consultant has worked on. This type of interview method tests candidates on their ability to plan for real-life business challenges. The use of cases provide a real example of an on-job experience and are intended to showcase how you structure your thinking and how you would approach the issue in question.

Case Interview Formats



Candidate-Led

Candidate led cases are among the most common cases and require the candidate to “lead” the interviewer through the case by asking questions and developing a hypothesis.



Interviewer-Led

Interviewer led cases give the interviewer the chance to test specific skills they are interested in, in addition to assessing your areas of weakness.



Written

A case study analysis requires you to investigate a business problem, examine the alternatives, and propose the most effective solution, using supporting evidence.



Group

Group cases involve 3-6 recruits working together to solve a single case. The group needs to build consensus on what the real problem is, they need to structure their analysis, and agree on a final recommendation.

Typical Presentation Format

- 1 Case Intro**
 - Interviewer states scenario or “case prompt”
 - Candidate clarifies and proposes a framework
- 2 Analysis**
 - Candidate dives deeper and probes for details
 - Interviewer provides data
- 3 Closing**
 - Candidate states final recommendation
 - Candidate answers questions and/or discusses risks

Case Analysis Process

1. Elaborate on the case presented
2. Identify the problem
3. Ask questions, clarify unknowns
4. State assumptions
5. Build a framework/structure
6. Analyze
7. Conclude/recommend actions
