



Turning Challenges into Opportunities



Financial Costs

Apply for scholarships, go for one semester instead of a full year, choose more economical locations, and create a budget to manage expenses. Use tools like <u>budgeting apps</u> and spreadsheets to track expenses and identify areas to save.

New Academic Structure

Research your host university's academic culture beforehand and seek support if needed. Adjust to your new schedule gradually. Talk to your host university's advisors and professors so they can best support you.





Homesickness

Use the time to explore new environments and meet people. Talk to local students and other exchange students, become friends, and explore the new environment together.
