How to Take a Professional Headshot at Home



Get Ready:

Select attire that aligns with industry standards, choosing solid colours or subtle patterns to keep the focus on you. If you're unsure about what to wear, check out the <u>Business Attire</u> report for inspiration and ideas on professional clothing.



Choose a Background:

Choose a simple, neutral background to avoid distractions. You can look at professional headshots in various industries for examples, or refer to the University's Student OneCard Photo Submissions here for guidance.

If you don't have a suitable background, consider using tools like Remove.bg or Canva to eliminate it. Then, you can place your photo on a plain background that aligns with your professional image.



Take the Photo:

Selfies are not considered professional photos. When taking a headshot at home, use a stand or tripod and the self-timer function, or ask a friend to help for a clearer, more professional shot.



Upload Your New Headshot:

Whether you use your original photo background or add a new one in Canva, you should now have a clean, professional headshot. Upload it to LinkedIn, your company website, or a conference badge and start networking!

LinkedIn Profile

Should be approachable and personable, often with a friendly expression and a polished look to reflect your professional demeanor.



Company Website

Typically needs to align with the company's brand, often more formal, with a clean background that complements the company's aesthetic.



Conference Badge

Requires a clear, straightforward image for easy recognition and to represent your company.

Useful Tips & Tricks



Be Well-Groomed

Ensure your hair is neatly styled and your makeup, if worn, is natural and professional.



Minimize Editing

Keep photo editing to a minimum to maintain a natural and authentic appearance.



Practice Good Posture

Stand or sit up straight and lean slightly forward to appear engaged and confident.



Appropriate Attire

Wear clothing that is professional and fits the industry standards to keep the focus on you.



Select Neutral Background

Use a simple, neutral background to avoid distractions and ensure the focus remains on your face.



Consider a Professional

Hire a professional photographer for high-quality results, as they have the expertise and equipment necessary.

Common Mistakes

Mistakes in your headshot can make you appear unprofessional and affect how you're perceived. These issues can undermine your credibility and personal brand. Some common mistakes include:
