

The Canada Excellence Research Chair in Migration and Integration program at Ryerson University provides financial support through the **CERC Migration Graduate Student Stipend** to successful graduate students applying to study in the area of migration.

How does a student qualify?

A limited number of stipends will be awarded to top, full-time MA and PhD students who are pursuing an advanced degree at Ryerson University. Students must be studying a topic related to migration or migrant integration.

What is the stipend amount?

A select number of qualifying students will be eligible to receive the following:

- For Masters programs: up to \$10,000. Available to incoming first- or second-year MA students.
- For PhD programs: up to \$25,000 per year, renewable for a total of four years, subject to annual review. Available to first-year PhD students entering a PhD program.

If a student receives funding from external sources, a top-up stipend may be possible. Full details can be found on the CERC Migration website.

What other benefits come with the CERC Migration Stipend?

Stipend recipients become an integral part of a vibrant research team led by Anna Triandafyllidou, the Canada Excellence Research Chair in Migration and Integration. Students will:

- be mentored by a member of the CERC Migration research team
- have their own, dedicated work space at CERC Migration offices
- attend monthly Migration Working Group meetings and present their research at a dedicated session
- receive methodology and professional development training by attending Migration Research Gyms

The Canada Excellence Research Chair in Migration and Integration program is a new research hub at Ryerson University dedicated to advancing our understanding of contemporary issues in migration.
