OSAP default rates reflect the 2020 repayment status of students who were issued either a Canada Student Loan and/or an Ontario Student Loan through the Ontario Student Assistance Program in the 2019-2020 academic year and did not receive a loan in 2020-2021 and who were in default of their repayment obligations in July 2022. Typically, these students would have exited studies at the end of the 2019-2020 academic year. Includes undergraduate and graduate students. A blank cell denotes data not available or not reported.
