2. Sport Media (2014) and Languages and Intercultural Relations (2016) are not included in the graduation rates because began after Fall 2013.

3. The Language and Intercultural Relations program is not included in the employment rates because they did not yet have any graduates in 2018.
4. The graduation rates shown understate the actual graduation rates because they do not count students who transferred to another university and then obtained a degree from that institution.
The graduation rates in the table indicate the percentage of newly-admitted students in first-year level on a full-time load in Fall 2013 who subsequently received a degree between 2014 and 2020 in any program area.
5. The employment rates in the table indicate the percentage of Class of 2018 degree graduates who were employed six months and two years after graduation.
6. OSAP default rates reflect the 2020 repayment status of students who were issued an Ontario Student Loan (OSL) in the 2017-2018 academic year and did not receive an OSL in 2018-2019 and who were in default of their repayment obligations in July 2020. Typically, these students would have exited studies at the end of the 2017-2018 academic year. Includes undergraduate and graduate students. A blank cell denotes data not available or not reported.
